Children who spend more time in natural settings are better able to concentrate, have better classroom performance, higher scores on standardized tests and are better problem solvers.

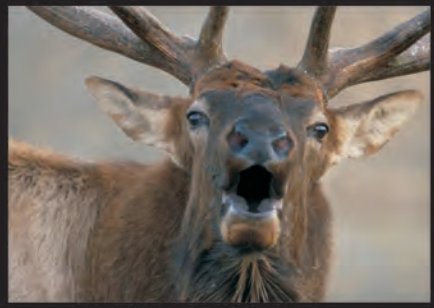

ATTENTION TEACHERS! Nature is a powerful force and **DISCOVER THE WILD** is a wonderful platform for elementary through high school students to learn about native wildlife first through videos in the classroom and then through personal encounters outside in your neck of the woods.





FIELD TRIPS allow students, some for the first time, to journey to the wild to study the animals and their habitats first-hand. You can customize them to suit your own individual class budgets, local natural areas, and native wildlife species.

As students learn about the individual wildlife and their habitats in an experiential setting, they in turn better understand the complex interrelationships in nature and their personal role in the environment.



FIELD TRIPS can include the following activities as students -

LEARN what wild animals and plants are endemic to an area

INVESTIGATE what components make up healthy wildlife habitat

CREATE a field guide of area wildlife to form a personal interest

USE cameras to collect their own wildlife photos and videos

ADOPT a plot of land for study to better understand the importance of biodiversity

VISIT wildlife art and photography museums to connect to nature that way
